


NATURAL GAS REBATE PROGRAM

Albertans are getting extra help with their natural gas utility bills this winter

From October 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023, most Albertans with natural gas service will receive a rebate from the Government of Alberta if Alberta's natural gas price is above \$6.50 per Gigaioule (/GJ).

The rebate applies to any Alberta residence or Alberta company with a natural gas usage under 2.500 GJ per year - a typical Alberta house uses around 120 GJ of natural gas per year!



The natural gas rebate will be triggered if the monthly natural gas rate charged by any of Alberta's regulated default supply providers is above \$6.50/GJ. All eligible customers will receive rebates, regardless of whether their local utility has

FOCUS ON SAFETY Loading/Unloading Equipment

EDERATION

HAZARD DESCRIPTION:

A near miss incident occurred where a mini track hoe was being loaded onto a flat deck trailer. The trailer was parked on a slight decline and while the equipment was being positioned into place, the trailer/vehicle started rolling forward even though the parking brake was engaged. The operator who was loading the equipment was able to stop the movement of the trailer/vehicle by rotating the cab around and putting the mini track hoe bucket into the ground. A bystander also jumped into the truck to try to stop it. Without the quick response of the operator and bystander, this incident could have been very serious with significant loss.

DANGERS POSED WHEN LOADING/UNLOADING EQUIPMENT:

- Equipment roll over/tipping hazard Unintentional movement
- Unsecure loads (not adequately secured for transport).
- Orisecute loads (the deequately secured for data Traffic/personnel in area. Overhead powerlines. Unsafe access to and egress from the trailer bed. Falling off the loading platform.

HOW TO SAFELY LOAD/UNLOAD EQUIPMENT:

- Provide appropriate training to workers responsible for loading/unloading equipment. Have the flatbed truck or trailer parked on level, stable ground with brakes set and the engine turned
- Ensure that the deck of the vehicle or trailer is clear of all debris prior to loading
- Align the ramps with the wheels/tracks of the equipment.

 Use smooth throttle applications while operating the equipment being loaded/unloaded
- Ensure parking brakes are fully engaged.
- Don't overload the trailer.
- Stack lighter loads on top of heavier loads.

 Spread the loads out evenly for balanced weight distribution.
- Secure loads properly.
- Ensure that the stacking arrangement is stable
- Ensure that the load has not shifted during transportation before unloading Ensure that all equipment used for unloading is in good working condition.
- Ensure the ramp width used can safely accommodate the width of machinery being loaded. Avoid the adjustment of the steering while on a ramp. Avoid driving onto a ramp at an angle.
- Extend all stabilizers fully.
- Use wheel chocks
- Designated loading/unloading areas should be sectioned off where required.


