Off-Leash Dog Park



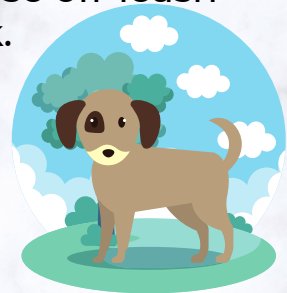
RULES

Responsible Pet Ownership By-law #6-2022

- Dog owners must be present and within view of their dogs at all times
- Aggressive dogs are not allowed in off-leash areas
- Dogs must be under voice control while off-leash
- Dog owners must have a leash in hand at all times
- Female dogs in heat are not allowed in off-leash areas
- Holes dug by dogs must be filled by the dog owner
- All feces must be picked up by the dog owner and removed or deposited in waste receptacles
- All dogs must be licensed in accordance with the Village of Halkirk By-law #6-2022.

Attention dog owners

- Dog owners can let their pets socialize and exercise off-leash in a safe environment
- Please remember to keep your dog on a leash when you are outside of the Off-leash Area. Other park users may not appreciate loose animals running up to them or may be afraid of dogs.
- Dog owners/walkers are legally responsible for their own dog(s) and any injuries or damage caused by their dog(s). Individuals who choose to use off-leash areas do so at their own risk.



- **Stoop & Scoop** – Please use plastic bags to pick up after your dog

- **Train your Dog** – Please train your dog to respond to commands, whether on or off-leash

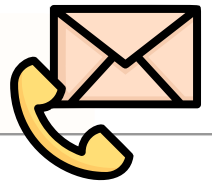
- **Respect other users of the park** – Walkers, joggers and other dog owners have a right to enjoy

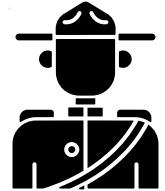
